## Natural Resources Canada Surveyor General Branch (SGB)

#### What we do:

- 1. Boundary Management (Survey Program)
- 2. Cadastral Processes (Survey Registry)
- 3. International Boundary (International Boundary Commission)
- 4. Geodesy (Canadian Geodetic Survey)

Numbers 1, 2 and 3 deal with legal boundaries that support land administration/land governance programs.

Number 4 deals with the science of geodesy including the design and engineering for the dissemination of the information in a format that supports Canada's economy.





## Surveyor General Branch (SGB) – How we operate

- ➤ We regulate a survey system Canada Lands Survey System
- ➤ We have multiple teams that help;
  - people to help understand and navigate the survey system,
  - safeguard to ensure documents meet a certain minimum standard before being accepted for recording,
  - 3. record, archive and prepare information for public availability.





#### **Canadian Constitution**

The Constitution Act, 1867 provides for the distribution of Legislative powers between the federal and provincial governments.

Section 91 – Lists the Powers of Parliament

e.g. "24. Indians and Lands reserved for the Indians"

Section 92 – Lists the Exclusive Powers of Provincial Legislatures

e.g. "13. Property and Civil Rights in the Province"

Anything not mentioned as belonging to provincial powers comes under the authority of the National Parliament.





#### **Jurisdictional Boundaries**

A jurisdictional boundary is a boundary between two domains that have separate jurisdictions over land administration (*National Standards for the Survey of Canada Lands* version 1.2):

- > Between countries, e.g. Canada United States
- > Between provinces, e.g. Nova Scotia New Brunswick (provinces)
- > Within a province/territory, e.g. Canada Provinces
  - > Indian Reserves
  - National Parks

#### Canada Lands

Definition of <u>CANADA LANDS</u> using common language:

- 1. Reserve lands defined under the *Indian Act;*
- 2. National Parks of Canada (including NP Reserves);
- 3. Offshore;
- 4. Only certain lands in the territories are Canada Lands BUT they use the Canada Lands Survey System for all lands;
- 5. Lands as defined in specific Comprehensive Land Claim Agreements

<u>Note:</u> for Canada Lands, Natural Resources Canada is not the Land Administrator. We run the Canada Lands Survey System, other government departments or other governments, administer the land (run the registry system).



#### Other Federal Lands

Federal lands that are not Canada Lands:

- Military bases
- Airports
- Post offices
- Small craft harbours
- National Historic Sites

Note: the Canada Lands Surveys Act has provisions for federal lands to be surveyed by the CLSS (upon request by the administrating department). In the Atlantic region, we have had CLS surveys of National Historic Sites for PCA.

These lands are administered by various groups PSPC, TC, DFO, PCA, etc.

## Surveying a Parcel in the Canada Lands Survey System (CLSS)

To provide survey services under the *Canada Lands Surveys Act*, the Act requires:

Surveys of Canada Lands

24(2) Surveys of Canada Lands shall be made in accordance with the instructions of the Surveyor General.

Who may survey Canada Lands?

26 (1) Subject to subsection (2), no person other than a Canada Lands Surveyor shall survey Canada Lands.

To provide survey services under the *Canada Lands Surveys Act*, NRCan/SGB Policy 2017-1 also applies:


#### **Policy**

1. Survey work affecting\* jurisdictional boundaries must be conducted by a land surveyor possessing dual CLS/Provincial licenses.

\* affecting means re-establishment or restoration of monuments or differences in found dimensions or shape

#### ESKASONI INDIAN RESERVE No. 3

#### DESCRIPTION

Eskasoni Indian Reserve No 3 is administered by the Eskasoni First Nation.

#### LOCATION

Eskasoni Indian Reserve No 3 is located in Cape Breton County, Nova Scotia, approximately 40 km southwest of Sydney.



#### LAND TITLE HISTORY

#### May 7, 1834 - ILRS No X12873

Minutes of Council setting apart lands on Cape Breton Island as Indian Reserves, including land at "Escasonick on the North side of St. Andrew's Channel". Area (by description): 2,800 acres.

#### April 13, 1852 - ILRS Nº 3642-101, PROVINCIAL ORDER IN COUNCIL

Provincial OIC vesting title to all lands reserved for Indians within Province of Nova Scotia with the Commissioner of Crown Lands.

#### December 31, 1866 - ILRS No 3643-101

Report from the Commissioner of Indian Affairs of Nova Scotia listing Eskasoni as containing 4,000 acres. A description in the same report states, "Escasonic Reserve contains four thousand acres, situate at Escasonic on the north side of East Bay".

#### July 1, 1867

Section 91 (24) of the British North America Act, 1867 (also known as the Constitution Act, 1867) confirms the legislative authority of the Parliament of Canada over Indians and lands reserved for the Indians.

#### May 16, 1919

The Nova Scotia Water Act, 1919, SNS [1919] c. 5, comes into effect vesting in the provincial Crown every water course1. It appears Eskasoni I.R. No 3 is partly affected by this legislation.

#### November 15, 1957 - ILRS No 10900, Ministerial Order

The Director of the Department of Citizenship and Immigration recommends the setting up of five bands on Cape Breton Island. The Eskasoni Indian Reserve 3 is allotted to the Eskasoni Band. See also OIC dated March 3, 1960 (ILRS Nº 8270).

#### **National Parks of Canada Creation**

The descriptions for National Parks and National Park Reserves are in Schedules of the *Canada National Parks Act* S.C. 2000 c.32

These descriptions are either a written description or reference to a survey plan or both.

Schedule 1 – National Parks

Schedule 2 – National Park Reserves (i.e., Parks with outstanding Indigenous claims, e.g., Sable Island and Mealy Mountain National Park Reserves)





#### **Land Administrators**

We will focus in on two (2) Land Administrators operating within the Atlantic provinces:

- 1) Indigenous Services Canada ISC
  - ISC maintain multiple land registry systems.
  - > All are registry systems (not Land Titles systems).
  - > ISC has online systems for their main land registries:
    - Indian land Registry System (ILRS) and
    - Framework Agreement on First Nation Land Management (FAFNLM).
  - > The ILRS has a public access and an internal access (password protected).
- 2) Parks Canada Agency PCA
  - > PCA runs a paper registry system with no outside electronic access.





## **Land Administrators – Registries**

It is important to note that for this session we are not going to enter or review any of the Land Registries the Canada Land Survey System supports.

Having access to, searching and extracting recorded documents in a Land Registry is always a critical component for researching boundary information.

Access to ILRS can be requested from Indigenous Services Canada.

#### MyCLSS is...

a collaborative site between the Association of Canada Lands Surveyors (ACLS), the Surveyor General Branch (SGB) and the Land Administrating Agencies to allow surveyors to:

- initiate a survey project
- · request survey instructions
- · use online tools to help the surveyor in the production of official plans
- · monitor project status until completion
- · submit digitally signed survey documents for recording
- obtain approvals

MyCLSS provides surveyors quick reference to relevant survey information to assist them through the survey process. Surveyors should contact the <u>ACLS</u> to obtain access information.

MyCLSS also provides an electronic tool for land administrators to carry out the approval process of survey plans. Administrators should contact the SGB to obtain access information.






## 1) Survey Plan Search

- Populated with current and historical records.







## 2) CLSS Map Browser...continued

> Millbrook IR No. 27










## 2) CLSS Map Browser...continued

- 2. Draw a rectangle


A dialogue box will open providing information from within the area of interest.










## Shows the extent of the plan on the Map Browser.




## Opens a new window to download the plan.






### **Common Survey Issues in Nova Scotia**

Plan 50220 CLSR Eskasoni IR 3

Road ownership on Reserves

1959 Agreement between NS and Canada confirmed the transfer of all reserve lands to Canada "except lands lying under public highways and minerals."

Who owns the road corridors through Reserves?




## Common Survey Issues in Nova Scotia

Watercourse ownership

1919 Water Act and the 1995 Environment Act state that "every watercourse ... is vested forever in Her Majesty in right of the Province"

How do NSLS handle land covered by water for freehold landowners?



#### NOTES:

(1) WATERCOURSES SHOWN ON LOT 221 AND LOT 222 ARE WITHIN THE JURISDICTION OF THE PROVINCE OF NOVA SCOTIA (WATERCOURSES BEING DEFINED IN THE NS ENVIRONMENT ACT AS (i) THE BED AND SHORE OF EVERY RIVER, STREAM, LAKE, CREEK, POND, SPRING, LAGOON OR OTHER NATURAL BODY OF WATER, AND THE WATER THEREIN, WITHIN THE JURISDICTION OF THE PROVINCE WHETHER IT CONTAINS WATER OR NOT, AND (ii) ALL GROUND WATER (PROVINCE OF NOVA SCOTIA ENVIRONMENT ACT 1994–95, c. 1, s. 3(be))) AS PER SECTION 103 OF THE PROVINCE OF NOVA SCOTIA ENVIRONMENT ACT 1994–95, c. 1, s. 103.
